When the children are in Year 6, they complete their Sacraments of Initiation when they make an act of faith for themselves and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and are filled with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

In my time here, I have come to realise very clearly how proud the Catholic people of Batley are of their Parish Church.

This became especially evident in the way the people of the parish pulled together to raise funds after a large section of the ceiling fell down in 2015. Thanks to the hard work of the parishioners, we are now nearing completion of restoration work; ready to face the future with confidence.

St. Mary's is our 'House of Prayer', a place where we encounter God in the ups and downs of life; where we can come quietly and bring the joys and sorrows, the hopes and dreams of our lives to God in prayer. It is where we celebrate important events of our lives: marriages, baptisms, first Holy Communion, funerals. It is in Church we pray for our loved ones who are sick or have died; where we remember and pray for family member anniversaries and offer Masses for the repose of their souls. It is in Church where we can experience the love and forgiveness of God, where we can start our lives again, knowing that we are God's children and God loves us. Above all, it is in Church we gather together as a family, to give glory and praise to God. Everybody is called and all are welcome - even if it is a long time since you were in Church.

People stop coming to church for all sorts of reasons:

- people simply drift away until eventually they stop coming
- people are just so busy that regular attendance at church seems impossible
- people were never brought up with regular attendance at church
- people have been hurt by life and feel church cannot help
- people have been hurt by the church and feel the church does not understand or care

Many people who have stopped attending Mass still feel part of the Church; still consider themselves Catholic. If that includes you, then may I reassure you that you are still part of the Church and you are still Catholic. St. Mary's is still your church; it is still your parish and you are very welcome.

The Church does not belong to anybody, least of all the Parish Priest. The Church belongs to our Lord Jesus, and He is always reaching out to you and wants to make you welcome into His Church, His parish. That is the purpose of this leaflet, to let you know that St. Mary of the Angels' Church is here for you and wants to reach out the hand of friendship and make you welcome.

You are the Church, I am your Parish Priest, that is why I am here.

If you would like to get in touch, I am more than happy to meet you, even simply for a chat; you are welcome to the Church or Presbytery (I will put the kettle on). Equally, I am happy to come visit you. I am not going to say "you must come back to Church" (although you know you are very welcome).
